Education Coordinator/Technician

As the Education Coordinator (EC) / Technician for the Will-So. Cook Soil and Water Conservation District (District), the person-will spend time working in both an educational and technical role.

As the EC, they will be the primary person responsible for educational outreach and for development and delivery of District curriculum for both school-aged and adult education, workshops, and special events. They will serve as the public relations point of contact and ambassador while working with partner agencies and clients to promote agricultural conservation to underserved communities and individuals within the District's boundaries.

As the Technician, the person shall receive training from District and partner agencies to perform field inventories, surveys and designs with assistance for soil conservation practices such as grassed waterways, terraces, vegetative filter strips, wildlife habitat, etc.

Responsibilities (in order of importance):

- Develop, organize and deliver educational workshops, seminars, presentations, displays, tours and special events with staff and outside speakers/presenters to educate clients on relevant soil, water, plant and wildlife conservation issues such as pollinator importance, native plantings, cover crops, pond stocking, soil and water erosion issues, conservation practices, wildlife habitat, and nutrient management.
- Develop visual and hand-out materials.
- Develop a District newsletter and assist with upkeep and maintenance of District website and social media (will train).
- Work with/educate local agricultural producers to participation in state and federal cost-share programs.
- Promote and grow the District's Scholarship program.
- Work with schools in Will and South-Cook counties to deliver conservation curriculum.
- Educate local government on the District's role in resource management recommendations in both the agricultural and urban communities.
- Learn and assist staff and partner agency staff with engineering surveys and designs that will promote soil conservation on agricultural lands. Training provided by both the District and its partner agencies.
- Organize and promote the District's spring and fall tree and fish sales.
- Organize District archives and history.
- Assist staff with office duties and other duties as assigned.

General Qualifications:

- Ability to work effectively with both external and internal customers
