

## ADVANCED CONSERVATION DRAINAGE TRAINING PROGRAM

## **WELCOME!**

Welcome to the Illinois Sustainable Ag Partnership's 2019 **Advanced Conservation Drainage Training Program (ACDT)**. This three-part series is designed to provide both technical training and the opportunity to connect to a strong network of other experts and practitioners who are involved in various aspects related to the design, implementation, and outreach of conservation drainage practices in Illinois. We will also provide ongoing support, networking opportunities, and resources as you work to apply the knowledge gained through the series.

Our 2019 program consists of intensive classroom and hands-on training for drainage designers, contractors, farmers, farmer advisors, retailers, and other agricultural professionals and conservation practitioners to increase understanding of the functioning of conservation drainage practices. Topics covered include not only technical details on planning, designing, and constructions, but also an introduction on why the practices are needed, the science behind why they work, the programs available for helping farmers implement them, and training on communication and outreach related to conservation drainage practices.

To enhance learning, training sessions will incorporate discussions, small group exercises, and field demonstrations. Our three sessions will focus on saturated buffers, constructed wetlands, and drainage water management.
